for future years. He ran a successful partnership of local authorities and business for several years called the South Yorkshire Green Business Club in which business, local government and Environmental agencies came together to better understand the climate change challengers and to assist business reduce their carbon emissions. Managing Waste Management for a population of over 500,000 also gave him experience in the waste field and how it contributes to Climate Change. Currently working as a private consultant to UK local authorities.
